### **Did You Know?**

SPLOST pays for the cost of debt service on debt that was incurred on new construction prior to 1997 (before SPLOST). We are still paying on this debt and will until 2021. ### **After School Activities**

After school activities are offered throughout the year for a variety of purposes: music practices, intramurals, detention, tutoring, clubs, etc. Students are expected to make arrangements for pick up prior to coming to school and must be picked up by 5PM unless a permission form stipulates otherwise. Students are expected to sign up for the specific activity each morning before 10 AM. Signing up indicates parent permission to stay and that the parents understand students must be picked up by 5PM. Students who are picked up later than 5:15 PM will lose the privilege of staying afterschool after the second warning. Students may not participate in any after school activity on the day of public or private detention, ISS or OSS.

### **Student Agenda**

Students are given one agenda at the beginning of the year and are expected to use the student agenda as an organizational tool as well as a hall pass. Students are expected to have the agenda with them at all times. Lost agendas must be replaced by the student at a cost of \$10. Should students need an agenda page for short term use, a copy can be obtained in the office on a daily basis. At the second request for an agenda page, the student will receive a warning letter; the third request, the student will receive detention. For each additional agenda page request, a detention will be assigned. If the student reaches 10 agenda pages, one day of ISS will be assigned.
