FULTON COUNTY DFACS REFUGEE ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

The Fulton County DFACS Refugee Assistance Program offers support to refugees who have been in the United States for less than five years. Priority is given to those receiving public assistance, the unemployed, and the employed who need retention services. The program offers grant support to area refugee associations and social service groups.

Refugees are persons who have been persecuted or in danger of being persecuted by their country's government or military force because of their political or religious affiliation. Refugees often apply to the U.S. for asylum to flee from persecution. After the processing and approval of these applications, refugees are given food, shelter accommodations, job placement services, and ESOL training.

Fulton County has contracted with six refugee service organizations to provide services to refugees from Cambodia, Russia, Thailand, Somalia, Kenya, and Bosnia.
