## Tim Corrigan selected as NELC area superintendent

At its board meeting last night, the Fulton County Board of Education named Chattahoochee High School's Tim Corrigan as the new area superintendent for the Northeast Learning Community.

In this role, which he begins July 1, Corrigan will be responsible for 13 elementary, five middle, and four high schools in the cities of Alpharetta, Johns Creek and Roswell. In addition to supporting their day-to-day management, he will work with the schools' principals and support staff to achieve their instructional goals.

"I am honored to be chosen for this important leadership role," said Corrigan. "I am committed to the students and staff of Fulton County Schools, and as area superintendent, I have a greater opportunity to support their success."

"Mr. Corrigan has a reputation as a strong leader and is well respected in the community," said Superintendent Jeff Rose, Ed.D. "His long-term knowledge of the Northeast Learning Community, as well as the entire school system, is an asset to this role."

Corrigan became principal of Chattahoochee High School in 2015, and before that was its assistant principal for 11 years. He has taught health and physical education in Fulton and Gwinnett counties, and also was an assistant principal in Forsyth County.

Corrigan earned his teaching certificate at the University of Illinois at Chicago, and attended the University of Georgia, where he earned a master's degree in education and completed work toward a specialist's degree in educational administration. He and wife, Denise, have three children (Emily, Class of 2012; Ben, Class of 2014; and Jack, Class of 2018) who all have graduated from Chattahoochee High School.
