Established in 1979, the Talented and Gifted (TAG) Career Internship Program provides intellectually and creatively gifted students in grades 11 and 12 the opportunity to explore potential career interests by working with professionals in the real world.

As a result of this experience, students are better equipped to make future education and career decisions. Internships are available through the TAG Program with the voluntary cooperation of businesses throughout the metropolitan Atlanta area. While students are unpaid, they do earn a numeric grade and elective credit for the experience.

Gifted Students Prepare for Internships

The internship program helps students:

- Develop a realistic picture of the selected career based on real world experiences
- Complete preliminary career research
- Enhance resumé and cover letter-writing skills
- Practice mock interviews with peers
- Complete career and personality assessments
- Explore on-site career opportunities
- Network with career professionals
