Financial Aid for College

FAFSA

If your student is a US citizen or has been a permanent resident in the US since August 2008, they are eligible to apply for financial aid to attend college. The application is available at fafsa.ed.gov. You will need a copy of your 2008 Tax Return to complete the application. Your accountant can help you complete the application if needed. Applications are available beginning in January. Apply early since federal student loans are available on a first-come first-served basis.

HOPE Scholarship

If your student is a US citizen or has been a permanent resident in the US since August 2008 AND has a 3.0 NGA (numeric grade average), they are eligible to be considered for the HOPE scholarship. The HOPE scholarship pays for tuition (except school fees) and gives a book allowance. When your student completes the FAFSA, this information is automatically sent to the HOPE scholarship application program.
