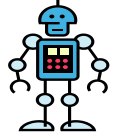

### Immunization Requirements

Georgia Law requires children attending school (Kindergarten - 12th grade) to be age appropriately immunized with all the required vaccines at the time of first entry in school. A new entrant is a child entering a school in Georgia for the first time or entering after having been absent from a Georgia school for more than 12 months or one school year. All students, regardless of grade and including foreign exchange students, must have the Georgia Department of Human Resources Form 3231 immunization certificate marked "Complete for School" or a legitimate Date of Expiration documented unless any of the following situations exist:

- Medical Exemption
- Religious Exemption
- For a justified reason and preferably after the parent/guardian has unsuccessfully attempted to obtain the required 3231 Certificate, the school official may grant a Waiver of 30 calendar days to give time for the parent/guardian to get a valid certificate. If the 30 day waiver expires or the certificate is not submitted within those 30 days, the student must be withdrawn and not allowed to attend school until a new certificate is submitted. (For example, students coming from out of state).
- In some cases, a waiver of 60 additional calendar days may be granted by the superintendent or designee to students entering Georgia public schools from out of state if documentation is on file from the county health department or a medical doctor stating that an immunization sequence has been started and can be completed within a total 90-day waiver period.
- Certificates with the Date of Expiration box marked must be monitored and tracked. A new certificate must be submitted within 30 days of the noted expiration date or the student must be withdrawn from school.

Immunization requirements for Georgia students were changed in July, 2007 for children entering kindergarten, 6th grade, and all new entrants into any grade. These students are required to meet the new requirements. However, children who were currently enrolled in school as of 3/2007 will not be required to meet the new rules unless and/or until they are attending school for the first time, entering kindergarten or sixth grade, and any student who leaves for longer than 1 year and returns who is considered a new entrant.

During the spring and summer registration period, in-state students without a valid GA Immunization Certificate may not be enrolled. Immunizations are required for diphtheria, pertussis, tetanus, hepatitis B, polio, measles, mumps, rubella, and varicella (chicken pox) and must be documented on the form 3231. In addition, all currently enrolled children entering 6th grade on or after July 1, 2007, must meet the following requirements:

- Two doses of Measles vaccine, two doses of Mumps vaccine, one dose of Rubella vaccine, or laboratory proof of immunity against each of these three diseases.
- Two doses of Varicella (chicken pox) vaccine or documentation of disease or laboratory proof of immunity.



### Are You Applying to Private School?

If you are applying to private school and have transcript requests to be processed, please deliver the packet to the front office. Evaluation forms will be forwarded to your child's teacher and/or counselor. Records will be copied and sent to the requesting school, along with the completed evaluation forms.

When submitting your request, please attach three stamps (do not place on an envelope). Your child's records will then be mailed to the requesting school via the U. S. mail. If you have any questions, please contact Lynn Greene, Data Clerk, at 770-740-7055 x 129. Thank you.

### Reminder About Absence Notes

District Policy O.C.G.A., 20-2-692, 20-2-693, 20-2-694 states:

#### Written Excuse for an Absence

*Any student who has been absent from school shall present a satisfactory written excuse to the principal or designee(s) within three (3) days of returning to school. The excuse must state the reason for the absence and be signed by the student's parent or guardian. Excuses will be kept on file at the school at least until the beginning of the next school year. Students who have missed ten (10) days of school or more in a school year may be required to provide additional verification including doctors' statements.*

Excuses may be submitted as an e-mail, handwritten note, Dr.'s excuse, or fax to the teacher and/or data clerk, Lynn Greene.

Home Access Center (the new Parent Connect) is an excellent resource to use to ensure your notes have been received by the teacher.

When you write any note to a teacher, please follow up on the receipt of the communication. It is the parent's responsibility to make sure a note is sent in and received by the front office.

### First Grade Science: SOUND Discovery Lab

### The Suffrage Movement Comes to CCES

Recently, students in 3<sup>rd</sup> grade at Crabapple Crossing learned all about Susan B. Anthony and the women’s suffrage movement. Anthony and others lead a fight to grant women the right to vote which eventually lead to the passing of the 19<sup>th</sup> amendment in 1920.

The program centered on Susan B. Anthony and her trial of 1872 in which she voted for Grant for President, testing out the 14<sup>th</sup> & 15<sup>th</sup> amendments and whether or not women had the right to vote. Students and teachers participated in the trial and events in Anthony’s life and learned that Anthony’s motto was “Failure is impossible”.

The students learned that even though the constitution was written in 1787, women did not have the right to vote until 1920. They also learned that the 19<sup>th</sup> amendment that was passed giving women the right to vote was called the “Susan B. Anthony Amendment”.

Students and staff of 4<sup>th</sup> grade walked away from the amazingly informative field trip reflecting on how strong Anthony must have been to stand up for the rights of women everywhere even when so many people were against her.

### GA Power Treats 3<sup>rd</sup> & 5<sup>th</sup> Grade Students to “Energy Education in the Classroom” field trips

Lenzaree Owen from “Georgia Power” visited CCES December 12-15 and presented to our 3<sup>rd</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> grade students Georgia Power’s new statewide energy education program. Students and teachers were so impressed by Ms. Owens and her delivery of instruction that we are asking her back next year!

3<sup>rd</sup> grade learned all about how to be energy efficient and how heat transfers and insulates because heat moves from areas of “high” temperature to areas of “low” temperature. They also learned the importance of insulating their homes so that their family can be energy efficient. Vocabulary terms like Caulking, Celsius, Conductor, Conservation, Electricity, measurement, thermometer are just a few of the words that were discussed.

5<sup>th</sup> grade students learned all about simple circuits and actually made one in groups. They also learned about insulators and conductors. In addition, vocabulary terms like electric current, energy audit, incandescent bulb, lumens, power source, and watt meter were defined and discussed.

Ms. Owens represented GA Power educational outreach program well while at Crabapple Crossing and we look forward to her visiting again next year.

### “Pilgrim’s Courage” Field Trip a Thanksgiving Treat

Prior to the Thanksgiving break, the 4<sup>th</sup> grade students of CCES were treated to an amazing in house field trip called “Pilgrim’s Courage”. Cathy Kaemmerlen with North Fulton Teaching Museum did an excellent job of portraying Mary Allen Cushman, one of the passengers on the Mayflower.

The Mayflower ship brought 100 pilgrims to Massachusetts in 1620. The students and the teachers got a glimpse into the Mayflower’s 65 days at sea, the struggle to start a new settlement and survive the first winter, the impact of the Mayflower Compact, making peace with the Indians and the first harvest feast. The audience also learned what life was like for the pilgrims, what they ate, what they wore, how they talked, and how they learned to make peace with the Wampanoag Indians.

Ms. Kaemmerlen’s presentation was a wonderful way to begin the Thanksgiving break and left a lasting impression on our 4<sup>th</sup> grade students and staff.

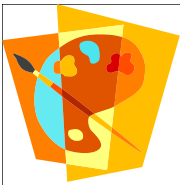
### 5 Ways to Exercise Your Brain From: “Disney Family Fun” Magazine, Dec/Jan 2012

Each month in grade level meetings, the teachers of Crabapple Crossing learn something new to use and apply in the classrooms. For the month of December, the teachers learned 5 activities to do with their students to exercise their brains in the classroom. These activities can also be applied at home.

- 1). **Test your senses-** Have your child work with clay and listen to music at the same time. Also, have your child close his eyes and try to identify two things at the same time like smelling a lemon and feeling coins.
- 2). **Get gaming-** Have your child master the strategy that it takes to play checkers, battleship, connect four and puzzles. This will give their brains a workout and increases its effectiveness.
- 3). **Take a hike-** Taking your family on a hike increases blood circulation to the head while encouraging you to do two things: walk and look around. Seeing new places forces your brain to build neural connections.
- 4). **Try a New Track** – Have your children get dressed with their eyes closed, or brush their teeth with the opposite hand which forces the brain to think differently.
- 5). **Add a Skill-** To help pump up your family’s brain power, you might have them learn a card game or cooking technique together. Or make it a family goal to learn a word together every week. These activities strengthen the neural connections in the brain.



**Evening of the Arts was a Great Success!**

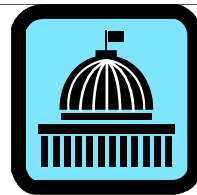
