

Centennial High School Public Detention

If you have been given an infraction ticket or issued a detention on a tardy pass, you must report to public detention(s) within one calendar week of the date on which you committed the infraction or issued the detention on the tardy pass. For example, if you were issued an infraction ticket or issued a detention on a tardy pass on Tuesday, you must serve your detention by the end of the following Tuesday. You must attend one **(two if cell phone infraction or 6th tardy)** of the following detentions:

Morning Detention Maximum: **42** students

Tuesday	7:30—8:30	Auditorium	Mr. Alexander
Thursday	7:30—8:30	Auditorium	Mr. Alexander

Afternoon Detention Maximum: **30** students

Monday	3:45—4:45	G-69	Mr. Alexander

The following rules apply to public detention:

- You must be on time. The doors will lock at 7:30 and 3:45. Late arrivals will not be accepted. No exceptions.
- No more than the maximum number of students per detention will be allowed. If the maximum number of students has been met before the doors lock, then you will be turned away. First come, first served!
- No food or drink. Water, however, is allowed.
- You must have work to do. You may read appropriate outside material such as newspapers and/or books. If at any point you are off task, you will be dismissed from detention and must come back another day.
- You must bring your infraction ticket with you along with a piece of identification.
- Use of electronic devices such as iPods is strictly prohibited. Cell phones and/or electronic devices will be confiscated and turned over to an administrator.
- Absolutely no talking or communication by other means to fellow students in detention.
- Absolutely no sleeping or putting your head down.
- Any misbehavior in detention will result in further disciplinary action.
