- Explain why we should recycle, reuse, and/or reduce.

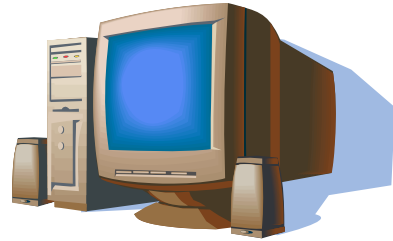
