

BUILDING “B” GETS AN A +!



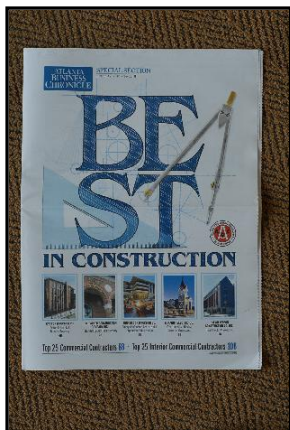
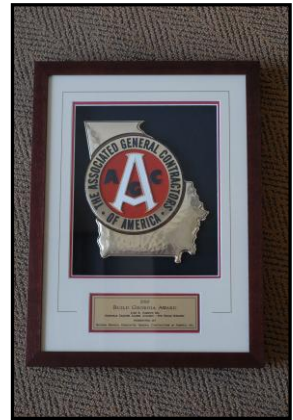
The Georgia Branch of the Associated General Contractors recently awarded Lusk and Company, Inc. First Place in the 2010 Build Georgia Awards. This award is in honor of “celebrating construction excellence” for the Hapeville Charter Career Academy 9th Grade building. Leed-certification is expected in the near future for this project which features green elements, including low-flow water fixtures and high-efficiency windows of insulated glass.

For the 2010 – 2011 school year, this building, known as Building B, will house eighth grade students from Hapeville Charter Middle School. Hapeville Charter Career Academy high school students have a new building (Building A) located adjacent to the award-winning building. The new building, also designed and built by Lusk and Company, is anticipated to be another Leed-certified, award-winning facility.

Hapeville Charter School, a Fulton County School, is comprised of two entities: the middle school, which includes grades 6-8, and the Career Academy high school, which currently includes grades 9 and 10. Grade 11 will be added in 2011-2012 and grade 12 will be added in 2012-2013.
