### HOW TO CREATE YOUR PERSONAL SAT ONLINE ACCOUNT

**Note: You will also need a second unique code available from the Media Center, Counseling Department, Mr. Nicholson or Ms. Singh**

1. Log on at <http://www.satonlinecourseschool.com>
2. Click on the "Register Now" link in the Student Registration box on the right-hand side of the Login screen. You will be asked for your school code. *The school code for Independence High School is 110061.*
3. Enter your school code, click the submit button, and the College Board Sign-Up screen will appear.
4. If you already have a collegeboard.com account, log in using your collegeboard.com user name and password. Otherwise, click the Sign Up button in the *Not a Member Yet?* area of the screen.
5. Follow the instructions to create your collegeboard.com account. You will use this account whenever you log into **The Official SAT Online Course<sup>™</sup>** .
6. Once you have created your account, you will be prompted to select your class. If you have not been assigned a specific class, please select the *independent study* class. Make your selections and click the submit button to proceed **The Official SAT Online Course<sup>™</sup>** home page.
