- **Stanford University** announced Wednesday that beginning next year it will offer free tuition - worth \$36,000 a year - to students whose parents make less than \$100,000 a year. Joining a trend started by other elite universities such Harvard, Princeton and Yale, Stanford is also eliminating student loans.

For low-income youth, Stanford will pick up almost the entire tab for tuition, room and board - a \$47,000 value. While the value of a home is still taken into consideration, it will play a smaller role than before.

Most of our scholarships apply to those who would like to commission as lieutenants in the US Army or the Georgia Army National Guard after they earn their bachelors' degrees from North Georgia College & State University in Dahlonega, Georgia. 1) The Army ROTC Scholarship.

- 70 available (\$2,800,000) each year, federally-funded.
- Pays room, meals, books, and monthly stipend.
- Worth \$40,000 over four years at North Georgia.
- To be eligible: 2.5 cumulative GPA on 4.0 scale; 920 SAT combined math and critical reading; college-prep or dual diploma; US citizen; meet Army entrance health and fitness standards (can't be over weight); no felony arrest.
- Will serve a minimum of 4 years in the Regular Army as a commissioned officer upon graduation, and 4 additional years in the inactive Reserve (IRR).

2) The North Georgia College & State University Military Scholarship (GMS Scholarship).

- 39 available (\$1,560,000) each year, state-funded.
- Pays for room, meals, books, tuition, fees, uniforms, and monthly pay and GI Bill benefits.
- Worth \$40,000 over four years.
- To be eligible: 3.0 cumulative GPA on 4.0 scale; 920 SAT combined SAT with 440 in math and 480 in critical reading; college-prep or dual diploma; citizen of Georgia; meet Army entrance health and fitness standards (can't be over weight); no felony arrest; must enlist in the Georgia Army National Guard before benefits are paid.
- Will serve 4 years in the Georgia Army National Guard as a commissioned officer upon graduation.
- This scholarship is designed for those who want to serve as officers in the Army, but stay in Georgia and serve as part-time officers while getting their advanced degrees or while starting a civilian career.

3) Leadership Scholarships.

- 15-20 available each year, privately-funded.
- Pays between \$1,000 and \$4,500 per year depending on scholarship funds and programs available any given year.
- To be eligible: be a cadet in the Corps of Cadets at North Georgia; 2.5 cumulative GPA or above.

Guild Scholar Scholarship Program:

Students who are legally blind are eligible to apply for this program by the end of their junior year which awards 12-15 scholarships in amounts up to \$15,000. Contact: www.jgb.org/guildscholar.asp

Horatio Alger Association Scholarship:
