TeleSchool Overview



What is TeleSchool?

TeleSchool is a Fulton County Schools strategy for learning continuity to be deployed for extended time away from school. This plan will start on the third day away from school.

How is TeleSchool implemented?

State Bridge Crossing Elementary teachers will communicate with their students' families through email communication. This weekly communication will include daily lessons that are to be completed to demonstrate continued learning. Families will be able to access all necessary digital resources through ClassLink (https://launchpad.classlink.com/fcs). Non-digital assignments will be included for students who have limited access to technology.

What are the expectations for students?

Student work will be limited to:

- 60 minutes per day for grades Pre-K 2
- 90 minutes per day for grades 3 5
 - o 35 minutes for ELA
 - o 35 minutes for Math
 - o 20 minutes for Specials
 - o 1 social-emotional lesson per week

Students are expected to complete graded assignments within two weeks of returning to normal school operations.

What type of support will be available during TeleSchool?

If students or families have questions about assignments during Teleschool, they should reach out directly to the teacher via email communication.
