#### Study Skills

With each new school year comes new and unique challenges. Developing your study skills is critical to helping you succeed in middle school and throughout your academic career! With some dedication and hard work, you will be on your way to success!

#### What kind of learner are you?

Figuring out how you learn best will help you to understand the best methods for studying. If you're unsure about what kind of learner you are, check out some of the options listed below:

- Kinetic: Do you learn best while you are on the move? If so, you may be a kinetic learner!
- **Visual/Spatial**: When learning, do you prefer having an image of the material that you are studying, to best remember the information? If so, you may be a visual/spatial learner!

- **Auditory**: Do you prefer to listen to information and incorporate music or sound into your study routine? If so, you may be an auditory learner!
- **Linguistic/verbal**: Would you rather write out your thoughts, read, and/or have a conversation with someone about the information you are learning? If so, you may be a linguistic learner!
- Interpersonal: Do you enjoy working in a group setting while learning? If so, you may be an interpersonal learner!
- Intrapersonal: Do you take time to reflect on the information that is being taught, to fully understand the material? If so, you may be an intrapersonal learner!
- **Existential**: Are you able to easily make connections and envision the big picture of what is being taught? If so, you may be an existential learner!

### **Parent Survey CCRPI**

Your opinion matters! Tell us about your experiences with the district and your school by filling out the College and Career Ready Performance Index (CCRPI) **Georgia Parent Survey** required by the Georgia Department of Education. This survey provides a foundation for your school's Climate Star rating score and is part of the CCRPI. These climate scores are an important indicator of culture and climate within each school in the district. Each school will receive a 1-5 star rating, with five stars representing an excellent school climate, and one star representing a school climate most in need of improvement.



The surveys are anonymous and confidential and will remain open through **Friday, December 15.** To access the CCRPI survey, click <u>here</u>.

#### **Student Survey CCRPI**

The Georgia Department of Education (GA DOE) requires all public schools to participate in their Georgia Student Health Survey. To see the GA DOE informational website <u>click here.</u> The survey has two parts: one for parents and one for students in grades 3 -12. Each school must have a 75% participation rate on the student portion of the survey. Schools failing to meet the 75% student participation rate will score 0.00 points on the school's CCRPI survey calculation under the survey portion of the School Climate Star Rating.

This GA DOE developed survey asks questions that are covered by the Protection of Pupil Rights Amendment (PPRA). For more information about PPRA, <u>click here.</u> PPRA requires that schools provide parents/guardians with advanced notice of student participation, the option to preview the student survey, and the ability for parents/guardians to opt their students out of any surveys that include PPRA protected areas. If you would like to opt your student out of participation in this survey, please email **Principal Thomas Garrett** requesting that your student not participate in Georgia Health Survey *prior to Friday, December 1st.*








# **Ridgeview Charter Middle School Spelling Bee**
