We hope that you all enjoyed having a few extra days in your weekend and hope you are energized and ready to get back.

As a reminder, September is Suicide Prevention Month. Classroom lessons for students will kick off on Monday, Sept. 11 to align with Suicide Prevention Week. Our staff received their training on the Signs of Suicide during our staff workday, and we wanted to provide our families with resources as well. Below you will see a handout that gives a few pointers on how to support your student's mental health. The most important things to remember as we move through this month are:

- 1. Create space for you and your family to discuss mental health in a positive way.
- 2. Listen without judgement.
- 3. Take your student's concerns seriously sometimes things might seem small to us because we're adults, but those things are **big** for our students.
- 4. Connect your student with resources when needed.

We know that this can be a difficult topic to think about and discuss, but it is important that we provide as much support for our students as possible. Suicide is a serious concern, but it is also preventable! We all want to do our part to help ensure our kiddos' health and safety.




After students learned manners and etiquette of おはし, chopsticks, they practiced how to use them at home! They sure can use おはし well!
