CLASS SCHEDULE

Centennial High School's school year is Comprised of 180 days. Students have a 6-period day, during which they participate in 55-minute classes.

CHS is on a semester schedule, and credit is awarded at the end of each semester.

CLASS RANK

Centennial does not calculate class rank, with the exception of determining which students have earned the valedictorian and salutatorian designations for each graduating class.

GRADE POINT AVERAGE CALCULATION

Student numeric grade averages (NGA) are calculated on a 100 point scale. The calculation is an average of final semester grades for every attempted course with the potential to earn high school credit.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION: Impact of COVID: Educational Setting

Fall 2020-Spring 2021- During the Fall semester of the 2020-2021 school year, students participated in remote learning up until October. At that time, students had the opportunity to stay remote and continue learning in the virtual setting or they could return to school for Face-to-Face instruction.

Fall 2021-2022- All students within Fulton County Schools returned to their home school for Face-to-Face instruction.

Impact of COVID: Grading Marks on Transcripts

Incomplete (I): An Incomplete (I) was entered as a temporary final course grade on the transcript of students who were affected by remote learning and was not able to complete at least 80% of the course's summative assignments.

Students with an Incomplete (I) had until the end of Summer 2021 to participate in Extended Learning opportunities to clear the Incomplete (I) and to ensure they received exposure to and mastery of missed content.

Credit (CR): Upon completion of an Extended Learning opportunity, the Incomplete (I) listed on the transcript was changed to Credit (CR) during the term the Incomplete (I) was received. No credit was awarded to the grading marks of Credit (CR). Instead, the final course grade and credit earned was listed on the transcript during the term the student participated in Extended Learning and showed mastery of course content.

Withdraw Fail (WF): Students who did not clear Incompletes (I) through Extended Learning by the end of Summer 2021, should have received a Withdraw Fail (WF). Withdraw Fail (WF) has no impact on a student's GPA. Students who received a Withdraw Fail (WF) are required to retake course, if needed for graduation.

Incompletes (I) for courses not needed for graduation remaining on student transcripts. Incompletes (I) do not impact numeric GPA calculations.

CURRICULUM

Centennial High School offers a diverse curriculum that meets individual student needs who seek a challenging college preparatory experience. All CHS students have a personal device (Dell Latitude). 87% of Centennial graduates attend institutions of higher learning. Centennial's curriculum offerings prepare students for the challenges beyond high school. Course offerings are determined by State of Georgia and Fulton County Board of Education requirements, student selection, availability of staff, and cost effectiveness.

Advanced Placement Course examinations are evaluated and scored on a five-point scale where a five is the highest score. Students scoring within the 3 to 5 score range are potentially eligible for college credit and are indicating their well-qualified college entrance performance.

Career and Technology Education Programs:

Audio/Visual Technology, Health Science, Criminal Justice, Engineering & Technology, Programming, Computer Science, Nutrition & Food Science, Business & Financial Services, & JROTC.

Dual Enrollment and Post-Secondary Options are programs by which students can earn high school graduation credit for courses taken at post-secondary institutions. Courses are offered both on and off campus. Students simultaneously enroll at both institutions or may attend the post-secondary institution altogether. Students must fulfill the high school graduation requirements as set by the Board of Education.

Talented and Gifted Programs serve approximately 30.5% of Centennial's population. The program augments the classroom activities through seminars, subject extensions, independent or directed studies, and career internships.

IB Diploma Programme is an academically challenging and educational program for juniors & seniors. It supports students at the university level and life beyond high school. The IB DP exams are graded on a 1-7 scale, with scores of 4 to 7 leading to possible collegiate credit. The IB Diploma Programme is recognized & respected by the world's leading universities & institutions.
