What is Dual Enrollment?

Dual Enrollment General Info

- Dual Enrollment is a State of Georgia initiative that allows high school students to take college courses through an approved college or university for high school credit.
- Participants must meet admission requirements for the institution they wish to enroll.
- Students can take classes online at home or at the local college.
- Offered during Summer, Fall, and Spring terms.
- Students cannot take more than 15 credit hours each term. Most students take 1-2 classes per semester. Most take their courses online to have more flexibility with high school scheduling.
- All communication happens between the student and the college, not the parent.
- Parking passes are awarded at the discretion of administration, not the counseling office and just because you have dual enrollment courses does not guarantee parking on campus.
- Students must READ EVERYTHING carefully or they will miss critical information.

Who can take DE courses?

State Funding

- State of Georgia pays for the class tuition, books, and mandatory fees. Some fees are NOT paid for by the state like science lab fees or late registration fees, etc.
- Students are not allowed to take more than 30 credit hours in total with Dual Enrollment. This is approximately 10 courses.
- Students cannot be funded for the same course twice.
- Students who withdraw from 2 college classes at any point are not permitted to continue in the DE program.
- Many colleges will not allow for a self-pay course if the student still has funding available to them through the state. If a
 student does self-pay for a course, then it will be posted to the high school transcript regardless of the final grade.
- Only Academic and Career Technical courses will be funded.
- Institutions must provide **required textbooks** at no cost to participating students for courses approved for DE funding. If the course textbook or homework delivery method is provided online or online materials are used in lieu of a physical textbook, the institution must provide the code at no cost to the student for courses approved for DE funding. Colleges send this information to students at the beginning of every semester. Questions need to be directed to the college.
- All students should verify that a course can be funded prior to registration. https://www.gafutures.org/checs/dualenrollment/DECourseDirectory
- Just because a course is listed as an approved course in the directory does not mean that the college will be offering that course for the term/date/time you want.

Once this is submitted, student will be added to the Microsoft Teams where the student will have access to all the assignments. Teams is where notifications, announcements, directions, files, etc. will be posted. Students should set up their Teams notifications, so they do not miss critical details.

Please allow 2 business days to be added to Teams.

Due by March 31, 2024

- Fulton County DE Contract completed every year no later than March 31, 2024
 - All students complete pages 1-6
 - Auburn First students complete pages 1-7
 - Non-Traditional DE Option complete pages 1-8 & must schedule a meeting with your counselor and parent.
- **Dual Enrollment Funding Application** <u>www.gafutures.org</u> to be completed every year. Student completes their application and then the parent will submit their approval. It is not complete until both portions are done. Must create a Ga Futures account if you do not have one. (Not including Auburn). **Make sure to use the 24-25 form!**
- College Application separate from the funding application; submitted directly to the university/college.

<u>Remaining Steps</u> – best to have completed by 3/31 but not required; however, the longer it takes you to get all the remaining documents submitted, then the longer it will take for a decision to be made by the college.

CURRENT DUAL ENROLLMENT STUDENTS (GSU & Gwinnett Tech)

- **Must do the annual Fulton County Dual Enrollment Contract
- **Must complete a new funding application
- **Register for classes & Upload a screenshot of their college class registration into Teams

Transcript Requests

Any student who needs an <u>official</u> transcript sent to the college will need to make that request through Ga Futures website.

- Go to www.gafutures.org
- Sign into your account (same account that you do your Dual Enrollment Funding)
- Go to the "My Ga Futures" tab
- Click on the tab that says "My High School Transcript"
- Make request from there.
- Make sure to list the correct college, some college names are similar.

**Ga Tech students do NOT request official transcripts. Ga Tech students will upload an unofficial transcript after spring grades have posted to their Infinite Campus portal. Go to your Infinite Campus app, click on the documents tab, download a copy of your transcript and upload that to your Ga Tech admissions portal.

**If you get an error trying to send your transcript, you likely do not have your Social Security Card on file with our school. See Mrs. Chilson during a Friday help session to get assistance or see Mrs. Movilla-Leal in the counseling office.

**If you do not have a social security number issued to you, then you will need to see Mrs. Chilson during any of the Friday help sessions.

Additional Paperwork Required by College

- Test Scores or Alternate Option each college has specific requirements for what test option will meet their requirements, please follow the college website for directions.
- Transcripts
- Review college website for all other required items that are sent directly to them.
- Review the https://ChattahoocheeDE.weebly.com site for additional resources
- Once accepted, the college will likely have some next steps to complete before being able to register for a college class.

Fulton County DE Contract - PAGE 2

- <u>Left hand side</u> is for any courses being taken through FCS or Chattahoochee (FVS / GAVS / On campus classes)
- Right hand side is for any courses being taken through Dual Enrollment
- All classes should total 6 courses. If taking a senior course reduction, that can be listed as one of them.
- Your school counselor will approve funding based on what is listed in the contract.

College Choices

- Each college has their own specific application and process. Students need to follow the directions on the college
 website to ensure they are meeting all the steps for the dual enrollment program. You should make sure you meet the
 minimum admissions standards <u>prior</u> to applying.
- Information is posted in Teams along with links to the specific dual enrollment offices. Students are on their own to get this completed. The high school does not submit applications on behalf of the student. If students have questions, they need to ask prior to the deadline.

- Students are welcome to apply to a different Dual Enrollment program; however, they must research those choices. <u>Participating Colleges List</u>
- Students must investigate all the processes for that college on their own.
- Students must still complete all the Assignments in Teams
 - Fulton County Schools DE Contract
 - Apply to the College (screenshot that application was submitted)
 - Ga Futures Dual Enrollment Funding Application
 - Upload Screenshots Course Registration
- It is up to the student to make any other requests to their HS counselor if they need additional documents submitted.
- Transcript requests need to be completed through Ga Futures.

Dual Enrollment: Options

The student is pursuing the following Dual Enrollment Option:

■ Traditional Dual Enrollment: This option allows high school students to take approved college courses while working to obtain the 23 credits needed to earn a high school diploma.

High School Graduation Course Requirement: 4 English, 4 Math, 4 Science, 3 Social Studies, 3 CTAE/Fine Arts/Foreign Lang, 1 PE/Health, 4 Electives.

Accelerated Career Diploma: Students pursuing this option must complete the following to earn a high school diploma:

- 2 English (American Lit & EOC required) 2 Math (Algebra 1 & EOC required)

Late July

Counselors host QUICK online Teams meeting with interested students to make sure their high school schedule and college schedule will "fit" together. Info will be posted in Teams when we get closer to that date.

August 1

Anyone not registered for a college class by this date will be placed into high school classes at Chattahoochee.

Course Options

Full Time or Part Time

Full-Time DE Student:

- At least 4 college courses totaling 12-15 college credit hours
- All classes are taken through the college (online or F2F)
- No courses have to be taken at Chattahoochee
- Student is still enrolled at High School and is fully eligible to participate in clubs, extracurricular activities, sports, and events

Part-Time DE Student:

- Fewer than 12 College Credit Hours
- Must be enrolled in 6 courses between Chattahoochee HS and the college
- Need to coordinate DE courses with high school classes that are offered.
- Allow for <u>SAFE</u> driving time between high school and the college
- Not allowed to enter/exit high school campus multiple times a day
- **Dual Enrollment classes are scheduled OFF CAMPUS.** This means that the student either takes a dual enrollment class at the college in person, or they can take the class online while at home. Students will need to provide their own transportation for any remaining Chattahoochee High School classes.
- The <u>only exception is the Ga Tech Distance Math Year 1 and Year 2 programs</u>. These require proctored exams on our campus by a Chattahoochee teacher throughout the semester. Distance math classes are ONLY held during 1st period.

End of Course Tests

Any student who chooses to take American Literature or Biology for the first time through the college MUST take the End of Course assessment at the high school. It will count 20% of their final grade on the high school transcript. This is a mandatory STATE requirement.

ENGL 2130 is American Literature at the college. You must take ENGL 1101 and ENGL 1102 prior to being eligible for ENGL 2130. This is a class that requires the EOC.



Scheduling

- This student took 2 college classes in the Fall semester and 1 college class in the spring.
- There is no "one way" to do dual enrollment.
- Students can mix / match depending on need.
- Every student must have a lunch period in their schedule.
- Students do need to have a plan for the entire year.
- Do not get hung up on where everything will fit because counselors will not know until end of summer.

Grading & Credit

Dual Enrollment Grading

Colleges assign letter grades and FCS converts those to numeric averages.

• A = 95
B = 85
C = 75
D = 70
F or WF = 60
```

FCS adds 7 honors points to the final <u>passing</u> college course grades

Example:

ENGL 1101: student earns a B on college transcript FCS transcribes that to an 85 unweighted; 92 weighted on HS transcript

- HOPE Scholarship: Core DE courses receive a 0.5 weight up to a maximum 4.0 and count as academic rigor. Grades earned in DE classes will count towards a student's <u>initial</u> HOPE eligibility.
- Final grades for <u>all</u> DE courses will be posted on the HS Transcript.

Credit & Withdrawals

- If a student withdraws from a college class, the student will earn a W on their High School transcript. This does <u>not</u> impact GPA.
- If a student withdraws past the midpoint in the college semester, the student will earn a WF
 which is the same as an F on the high school transcript. It is highly recommended to look at the
 academic calendar for all important dates at the college. Every college is different.
- If a student withdraws at any point from 2 dual enrollment classes, the student is no longer eligible to participate in the program.

Random Info

Good to Know

- Lockdown Browser Issues some classes require students to add software to their computer called a "lockdown browser" which prevents cheating issues. This software cannot be installed on Fulton County devices, you will need a personal laptop/computer to take tests, or even go to the campus and use one of their computers.
- Social Security Number if you do not have one, you can still take dual enrollment classes, but to send your transcript you will need to see Mrs. Chilson or Mrs. Movilla-Leal. You may also have to provide additional documentation to the college.
- Missed Assignments If you miss an assignment or a test or anything for the college class it can greatly affect your overall grade.
- College Grades You must make Satisfactory Academic Progress to be able to continue college classes, each college sets their own standards, but generally C's or better are expected.
- **Funding** Your account at the college will show that you have a balance on your account up until midway into the semester. Please do not worry! They get their funding from the State of Georgia, and it takes time for that balance to be removed from your account.
- Course Changes There are specific times when a student can make changes to their college classes, if they do, they must inform their counselor PRIOR to making the change or the college may drop the class.
- Parents make sure you complete your portion of the funding application; nothing moves forward without parent approval.
- Selective Service males who are 18 years old OR turn 18 during the semester MUST register for the selective service.

Things Chattahoochee Cannot Manage

- College schedule and course availability
 - It is your responsibility to ensure you are at your college exams on the date and time outlined in your syllabus.
 - College breaks/holidays may be different than those outlined by FCS.
 - College classes are not always offered at times that align with CHS' schedule. Additionally, popular course times fill up quickly.
- Acceptance process
 - Students should contact the DE Office or the Admissions Office at the college
- Troubleshooting any holds on admissions or registration
 - Students should the contact the DE Office at the college to clear holds and/or troubleshoot any registration questions. Some holds can be cleared by following the directions on the hold.
- Communicating between you and the college about individualized situations (example: an absence, textbooks, a missed quiz, etc.). All communication with the college should be done through the student's college email address.
- Transferability of courses taken through Dual Enrollment students need to have those conversations with the colleges where they plan to later enroll to make sure credits will count for credit at that institution.

Your Counselor is here to advise and support your Dual Enrollment participation process, but it is important to remember that you will be an independent college student while you are still in high school and must meet the same expectations of an undergraduate student.
