COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

AP Macroeconomics - Students learn how economic data (GDP,

Unemployment, and Inflation) are calculated. Students then learn about fiscal and monetary policy options to correct problems that arise in the

AP Microeconomics - Students learn how individuals and businesses interact with each other. Topics covered include monopolies, oligopolies,

monopolistically competitive firms, and perfectly competitive firms.

TIME COMMITMENT:

Students should expect to spend 4-8 hours per week outside of class to be successful in these courses.

TYPES OF WORK IN THIS COURSE:

Macro - recommended for students interested in AP Econ Course credit. Micro - recommended for students interested in majoring in business or economics.

STUDENTS SHOULD KNOW:

Students must be able to do basic Algebra and Graphing.

TIME COMMITMENT:

<u>AP Macro</u> - Half of the students reported that it would take 4-8 hours to be successful while the other half reported up to 3 hours per week. <u>AP Micro</u> - Majority of the students reported it should take up to 3 hours per week.
