Greetings Hornets,

It has been a pleasure to welcome some of our students back to Roswell High School for Phase III. We have had a good couple of days as we put our plans into place and do everything we can to run our school while keeping students safe.

Here are some other common questions that have been asked:

Do students have to be on campus if they have a Georgia or Fulton Virtual Class?

- The answer is "no." In fact, they should not be on campus.

What if students come on the wrong day?

- If a student comes on the wrong day they will be allowed to attend and participate in the class but it is important that they come on the correct day to help us manage student numbers.

Will the mask mandate be a rule for the remainder of the semester?

- The staff and student mask mandate is in effect for the foreseeable future.

If a student is in Face-to-Face and stays home to work because the student is ill, can that student be marked as "Present?"

- It is important for legal and medical reasons that teachers accurately record who is physically present. Therefore, the answer to this must be a "no."

If a student want to switch from URL to Face-to-Face or back, is that allowed?

- Yes-we will allow one switch during the semester. Please email your student's counselor or Assistant Principal Josh Martin.

Can students who are in URL participate in clubs and activities?


- Yes

So do not kids not have school on Wednesday?

- Wednesday is meant as a "catch up" day so while students are not in the building or having to follow their schedule, we do expect them to "engage" with their teachers. For example, some teachers may have students turn in an assignment, click in on a form, or engage in a discussion. Please also note that Wednesday is a test day for Math and Social Studies so students may have an assessment for one of those classes, during that class period. ***It is not a free day!***

Recovery Policy

As you may have heard, there has been a change in the District's Recovery policy.

As of Monday, September 21, 2020, the new Recovery policy is as follows:

- Quizzes may be considered as summative assessments Students will have one (1) attempt to redo/retake an assessment.
- Students who achieve a 79 or less (less than an 80) are eligible for a redo/retake.
- Students can earn up to an 89 on a replacement grade on a redo/retake.
- Student redo/retakes must be completed 10 school days prior to the end of the semester.

For assignments that were due from the beginning of the school year until Friday, September 18, 2020, we are going to adhere to the previous Recovery policy:

- Per the District's URL recovery policy, students may recover any failed assignment during URL learning to earn a passing grade (70%). This may only be done three times per assignment.

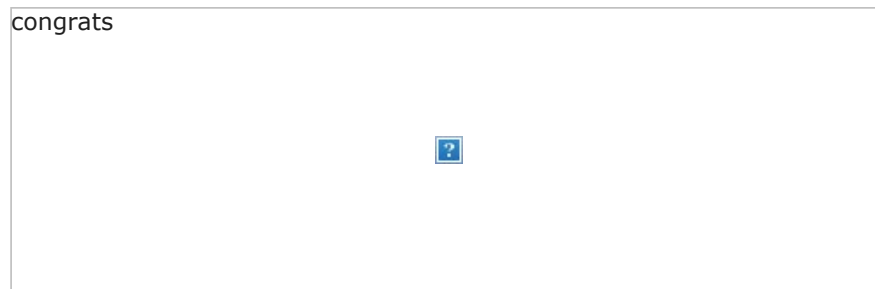
Please remember that this is in place for this semester.

Habitat for Humanity (Thanks to Erica Jones!)

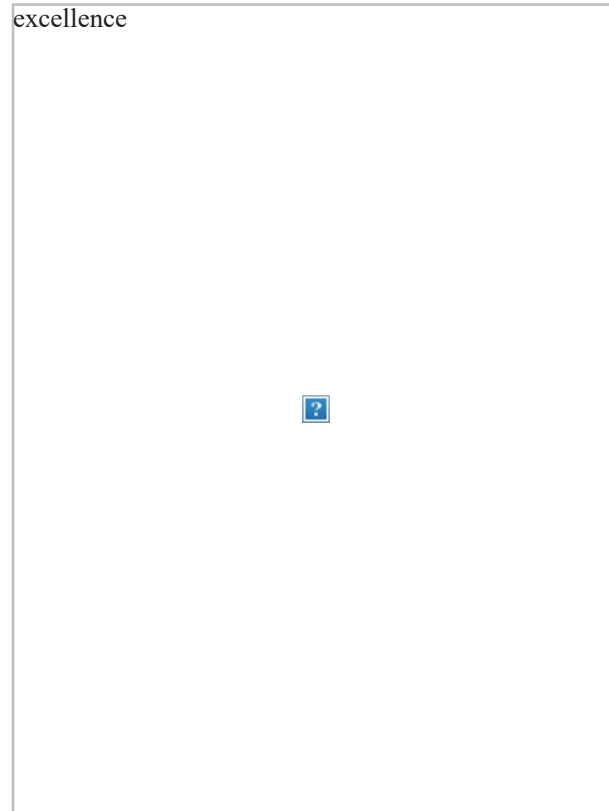

Staff of Excellence

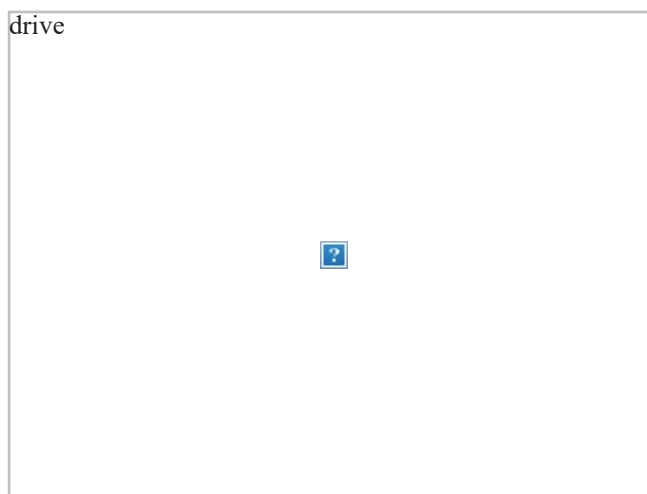
Congratulations to Roswell Media Specialist Sara Allegood who was selected as the Staff of
