
- High school course at the <u>honors level</u>

9TH LIT/COMP HONORS (CORE CREDIT)





Analysis- High level analysis of texts; best suited for the most avid readers and writers

Mature content—<u>Some</u> novels include sensitive, adult topics and themes

(sexual content, suicide, language, etc.)



Credit—at the end of the year, students can choose whether to accept the grade

-If the student chooses not to take the grade, they will retake the course as a 9th grader.
