SCHEDULE CHANGES

For Face-to-Face classes, schedule changes after registration will require:

- the approval of the student's home school
- available space in the course at the summer learning site

STUDENT ATTENDANCE RULES

Students will be allowed one absence per course for illness and emergencies. Being tardy 30 minutes or more constitutes an absence. Four tardies of less than 30 minutes will constitute an absence. Upon a second absence, students may appeal to the summer learning administrator for a waiver. Only cases in which both absences are deemed beyond the control of the student and parent(s) will the student receive a one-day extension. Students having two absences who do not receive a favorable ruling from the summer learning administrator will forfeit credit for the course.

TRANSCRIPT DROP DEADLINE

Courses dropped before noon on Wednesday, June 21, 2023, will not appear on the student's transcript. The request to drop the course must be in writing and received by the summer learning administrator before 12:00 p.m. on June 21. Courses dropped after these dates and times will appear on the student's transcript. Students who drop a course will not receive credit for the course.

END OF COURSE TEST & FINAL EXAMS

The state has not waived testing requirements for high school students in American Literature, US History, Biology, and Algebra I. As a result, Fulton County will offer EOC exams for students in these courses. All students taking EOC courses in summer learning will take/retake the EOC. The EOC will count as 20% of the student's grade. If a parent chooses to refuse testing for their child, he/she will earn a 0% for the EOC (weighted at 20%). To refuse testing, please contact your student's teacher.

The EOC exams will be given on July 5-7. All students who plan to participate in the exam must adhere to their school's exam schedule. No EOC tests will be given before or after this exam window.

INSTRUCTION

A competency-based learning model will be used for face-to-face summer learning courses. At the beginning of each lesson students will take a pre-assessment. If the student earns 70% or higher on the pre-assessment, s/he will advance to the next lesson. If the student earns < 70% on

the pre-assessment, s/he will engage in the lesson and complete all assignments. During this time, teachers may provide direct instruction on targeted concepts. Students should seek teacher support when they do not understand a concept. Upon completion of the lesson, students will take a post-assessment. If the student earns 70% or higher, s/he will advance to the next lesson. If the student earns <70%, the teacher will provide targeted instruction to address student misconceptions and re-set the post-assessment for a second attempt. Students have three attempts to earn a 70% or higher for each lesson.

GRADING

Pre-assessment scores of 70% or higher will be recorded in the grade book in the Major category. Pre-assessment scores below 70% will not be recorded in the grade book. The final post-assessment score for each lesson will be recorded in the grade book in the Major category.
