Digging in the Dirt: Greenhouse

North & South Fulton Master Gardeners

Bring the wonders of gardening and nature to children's lives when they dig in the dirt, plants seeds, transplant seedlings, harvest and eat plant life. Vibrant colors, interesting textures and tastes will be explored, while connecting with nature through environmental awareness. Students visit the Teaching Museum Greenhouse and participate in 4 different sessions where they learn about the technology of a greenhouse, the science of plant cultivation, the ways that plants can dance and make/eat a salad from plants they have learned about and planted. Allow two hours for the greenhouse visit and learning stations.

STEM Discovery: Exploring Seeds & Plants

North & South Fulton Master Gardeners

A hands-on investigation of seeds and plant parts will have your students' thumbs turning green! Our educators will travel to your school and visit each first grade class for a one-hour interactive lesson introducing the parts of plants and seeds. Students dissect and observe a seed with a microscope. They create their own mini greenhouse nurseries to germinate five seeds. These "greenhouse nurseries" will hang in a sunny window, so students can watch the progress of their seeds.

With the support of her mother and her faith in the goodness of people, Ruby was the first to test this ruling at this New Orleans school. Learn about segregation in the 60's in America and how to face up to bullying.
