1st Grade Reading

By May 2022, 80% of students in 1st grade receiving Tier 3 interventions will meet their stretch growth on the iReady End of year diagnostic assessment in reading.

1st Grade Mathematics

By May 2022, 80% of students in 1st grade receiving Tier 3 interventions will meet their stretch growth on the iReady End of year diagnostic assessment in math.

1st Grade Focus areas

- To recognize a minimum of 175 High Frequency Sight words
- Read for fluency and comprehension
- Develop an understanding of addition and subtraction and strategies for addition and subtraction within 20
- identify numbers 0-120

Teacher/Support Staff will...

- Provide parents and student with digital resources they can use at home.
- Provide parents with academic workshops that focus on reading and math strategies.
- Provide Parents and students with reading log to encourage reading nightly for 10 to 15 minutes.
- Provide a Parent Resource Center and encourage parents to check out reading and math materials.
- Provide a list of high Frequency sight words that parents can use to practice

Parent/Guardian, and Family will....

- Use digital resources at home with my child.
- Attend school wide academic workshops which will focus on reading and math strategies. This will allow us to utilize this at home to better support my child.
- Read with your child for 10-15 minutes daily and help them log their books.
- Use the Parent Resource Center to check out reading and math materials.
- Use the sight word list with my child at home to practice.

Students will....

- Use digital resources at home with my parents/guardian and or family.
- Use materials from parent workshops that parents/guardian attended that focus on reading and math.
- Use the resources that my parent/guardian check out from the Parent Resource Center.
- Read for 10-15 minutes daily with family member(s).
- Practice sight words with family member(s) at home
