School Goals for 2021-2022

Kindergarten Reading

By May 2022, 80% of students in Kindergarten receiving Tier 3 interventions will meet their stretch growth on the iReady End of year diagnostic assessment in reading.

Kindergarten Mathematics

By May 2022, 80% of students in Kindergarten receiving Tier 3 interventions will meet their stretch growth on the iReady End of year diagnostic assessment in math

Kindergarten Focus areas

- Students will become fluent readers by mastering and recognizing at least 75 high frequency sight words
- Students will build a strong foundation in number sense by counting 0- 100, number recognition 0-20, and comparing numbers.

Teacher/Support Staff will...

- Provide parents and students with digital resources they can use at home.
- Provide parents with academic workshops that focus on reading and math strategies.
- Provide parents and students with reading logs to encourage reading nightly for 10 to 15 minutes.
- Provide a Parent Resource Center and encourage parents to check-out reading and math materials.
- Provide a list of sight word that parents can use to practice with their child at home.

Parent/Guardian, and Family will....

- Use digital resources at home with my child.
- Attend schoolwide academic workshops that focus on reading and math strategies to support my child at home.
- Read with my child for 10-15 minutes daily and help them log their books.
- Use the Parent Resource Center to check-out reading and math materials.
- Use the sight word list with my child at home to practice.

Students will....

- Use digital resources at home with my parents/guardian and or family.
- Use materials from parent workshops that parents/guardian attended to help me with reading and math.
- Read for 10-15 minutes daily with family member(s).
- Use the resources that my parent/guardian checks out from the Parent Resource Center.
- Practice sight words with family member(s) at home.
