

SGC May Meeting Minutes

5/16/2023

Attendees: Ms. A. Dallas, Mr. J. Burney, Dr. R. Brown, Dr. S. Hall, Ms. Kemp, A. Robinson.

- At 2:20 p.m. Mrs. Dallas motioned to call the meeting to order Ms. Kemp second. Motion carried.
- Dr. Hall read April's meeting minutes. Mrs. Dallas motioned to accept minutes as read. Ms. Robinson second. Motion carried.
- Dr. Brown thanked SGC for the selection for spending of the Charter Dollar Funds for the 2022-2023 school year. She said the exact amount of any remaining balance was presently unknown, however, she was sure it was close to \$0.
- The SGC District personnel has requested that each member of SGC complete an individual survey and also complete a survey in collaboration with the school's SGC members during the monthly meeting. The SGC members completed the survey together.
- Dr. Brown reflected on Woodland's progress since the beginning of the 2022-2023 school year. She also recapped how January-May and showed how some of Woodland's academic goals were met or showed improved proficiency. Work has been recurring through ILT/supportive learning by using PLCs to provide feedback to teachers. Teachers used feedback to make proper adjustments to increase proficiency or mastery. During Second semester a reboot program in ELA was implemented during Intervention Block to prepare for GMAS.

SGC shared accomplishments in 2022-2023 were shared which were: Woodland worked on Relationships and Routines, Tier 1 Instruction, and Intervention. Safety of the school was a priority, Woodland also streamlined assessment data to make adjustments in teaching and learning.

- Dr. Brown stated our last site visit by Dr. Campbell identified a few areas needing growth and improvement. She shared that Woodland didn't quite meet the disciplinary goals; however, we are working to improve.

- Dr. Brown explained the disciplining process to council members and how it affects data. She also shared that preliminary scores had begun to trickle in for SS and Science. Math and ELA are taking a little longer because the school is required to test 95% of its students to meet CCPRI. We're on track to complete this task and students are making up test as we speak.
- Dr. Brown discussed the results of teacher's opinions of student uniforms for the 2023-2024 school year and shared that those results along with the SGC's votes have culminated into the decision for students to wear (MANDATORY) uniforms during 2023-2024 school year. They will wear collard white, yellow, or light blue shirts with navy or Khaki colored pants. All SGC members agreed to the new school uniforms policy. Dr. Brown shared that the use of uniforms could minimize the need for staff needing to call home for student wardrobe changes.
- Mrs. Dallas and Dr. Brown thanked all SGC members for participation on the SGC who were rolling off the committee. Dr. Brown stated that Dr. Hall could remain on the committee if desired, Dr. Hall accepted the offer. Mr. Burney stated how it had been an honor to serve, however, he would roll off. Ms. Dallas and Dr. Brown stated that Ms. Beasley and Ms. Graves were voted in and would be joining the council in the Fall. Dr. Hall congratulated Ms. Dallas for being re-elected to the council and Dr. Brown expressed how principals could appoint others to the council.
- Mrs. Dallas asked for a motion to adjourn the meeting. Mr. Burney motioned to adjourn; Ms. Kemp seconded. The meeting was adjourned at 2:41 PM.
