Wolf Creek School Goals 2019-2020:

We are committed to increasing the percentage of K-5th grade students scoring in the 30th percentile or higher on i-Ready Assessment to 65% in Math and 75% in ELA by May, 2020.

We are committed to increasing the percentage of our current 3rd – 5th grade students scoring at the Proficient and Accomplished Levels on the 2020 EOG Georgia Milestone Assessment in ELA/Writing content area to at or above 48% by May, 2020.

We are committed to increasing the percentage of our current 3rd-4th grade students at the Proficient and Accomplished Levels on the 2020 EOG Georgia Milestone Assessment in the area of Math to at or above 53% by May, 2020.

Focus Areas for Wolf Creek Wolves (ELA): We will assist our K-5th grade students to become strong readers of both literary and informational text by focusing on the following areas:

- K – 3rd grade students will master sight words and apply phonetic skills in decoding
- 3rd-5th grade students will use root words, prefixes and suffixes to determine the meaning of unknown words
- K-5th grade students will utilize/monitor reading strategies that build fluency and comprehension

Focus Areas for Wolf Creek Wolves (MATH):

We will assist our K-5th grade students to become stronger in the content area of math by focusing on the following areas:

- Building fluency with addition, subtraction, and multiplication and developing an understanding of multiplication and division strategies within 100
- Solve multistep word problems
- Instruction that facilitates the development of Standards of Mathematical Practices in all students.

Increasing Literacy Skills K- 5TH GRADE

As a school:

- We will provide students and parents with a list of instructionally appropriate books to read at home for a minimum of twenty minutes each night.
- We will provide academic parent workshops that focus on strategies for helping their child develop reading skills.
- We will provide resources in the Parent Resource Room to aid in increasing reading skills.

As a parent:

- I will ensure that my child reads the books provided by his/her teacher for a minimum of twenty minutes each night.
- I will attend workshops that are offered by the school to obtain information to aid in developing reading skills. If I cannot attend, I will request the strategies presented from the teacher
- I will take advantage of the resources available in the Parent Resource Room.

As a student:

- I will bring home books provided by my teacher and read them at least 20 minutes per night. I will advise my teacher when I need additional books.
- I will take advantage of the materials provided at parent workshops that provide strategies to developing reading skills.
- I will encourage my parents to visit the Parent Resource Room to obtain resources to aid in increased reading skills.

Increasing Math Skills K-5TH GRADE

As a school:

- We will provide parents with math learning materials to reinforce fluency in basic math facts to use with their child for a minimum of ten minutes each night.
- We will provide links on our web page or class newsletter that will feature games that reinforce fluency in basic math fact,
- We will provide a Family Math Night for parents that will allow them to participate in math games with their child and take-home math materials to use with their child. If parents cannot attend, we will provide materials in the Parent Resource Room.

As a parent:

- I will use the math learning materials with my child each night for a minimum of ten minutes.
- I will read the class web page and/or newsletter and have my child visit the web links that feature games that reinforce fluency in basic math facts.
- I will try to attend Family Math Night offered by the school. If I cannot attend, I will ask the teacher for the materials presented at Family Math Night to assist my child at home or visit the Parent Resource Room.

As a student:

- I will use my math learning materials each night for a minimum of ten minutes.
- I will visit the math website and play games featured on the site that reinforce fluency in basic math fact.
- I will bring home notices about Family Math Night and attend with my family.
