Did You Know? – Last year, a little less than 90% of our student population attended at least 90% of our school days. As of November 1st, we have about 93% currently at 90% attendance or above. Attendance is a critical factor in a student's success in school. Missing even a day every other week can lead to significant learning gaps and challenges for students.
