Processes and Procedures Reminder(s)/Update(s):

At Fulton County Schools, we prioritize student safety. Emergencies happen. When they do, preparedness is the key to handling them well. We ask that all parents or guardians who have not listed an emergency contact update their emergency contact list to include at least <u>one person who is not the parent/guardian</u>. If the parent or guardian is not accessible due to an emergency, it is important that the school has an approved person to contact regarding your student.

News and Notes:

FREE AND REDUCED-PRICE MEAL BENEFITS - To continue free or reduced-price meal benefits for students each household must complete a new application every year. Free and Reduced Meal Benefits will end on September 20, 2023, if_the household has not reapplied for SY 2023-2024. If there is an interruption in benefits or the household does not reapply, the household is responsible for payment of meals until the Free and Reduced Application is approved. To help assure continuation of benefits, the household must complete an online application by September 19nd 2023 at www.fulton.schoollunchapp.com or have a paper application turned in to the school cafeteria manager before September 16th, 2023 or. Be sure to list all the students in the household on the application. Keep in mind, the application may take up to 10-days to process. - 7th Grade Parents ONLY: All 7th grade students will be taking the NWEA MAP assessment between September 25 and October 6th, 2023. This assessment is a computer adaptive test that measures skills in Reading and Math. MAP is used as a universal screener and a nationally normed assessment. The results help determine a student's overall academic performance level and identify students who may benefit from additional services or support to meet their learning goals. MAP scores will not be entered into the grade book.

The Math MAP assessment will be given during the window of September 25th-September 29th, 2023, during 7th grade math classes. The Reading MAP assessment will be given during the window of October 2nd-October 6th, 2023, during 7th grade ELA classes. The test will not take the entire week. It is estimated to be between 45 and 60 minutes long.

We have taken steps to decrease the wait time for entry and have adjusted our gate procedures for games. We have added additional gates with additional staffing in place to verify ticket holders. To assist our staff members, please plan to have your tickets up on your phone and ready for verification. Once verified you will be handed a wrist band, we would appreciate your support in wearing these while attending the game.

In addressing concerns with our student section, you will notice a change to our student fan section with added supervision present. Increased staff presence will be noticeable at our concession areas and within our restroom facilities. We urge our community members to please report, immediately, any issues found in the restrooms to an officer or administrator stationed at the front gate.

We would also like to share the following stadium guidelines:

- No Re-Entry.
- No Outside Food/Drinks and No Athletic items allowed Ex: Frisbees, Balls, Bats, etc.
- Clear bags only
- Elementary and middle school aged students must be accompanied by a parent/guardian.

- If you need to check your child out of school early, **please remember we do not allow checkouts after 3:30!** If they are leaving early, send them in to the Front Office in the morning with a note from you. - The Front Office closes at 5:00, so please do not expect anyone to answer the phones or be there to buzz you in unless there is an evening activity.
