School Goals 2019-2020

2nd Grade Reading

By May 2020, the percentage of 2nd grade students scoring on or above level on the Developmental Reading Assessment (BAS) will increase by 10%.

2nd Grade Mathematics

By May 2020, increase the percentage of Second Grade students performing at or above grade level as measured on the iRead Assessment 10%.

2nd Grade Focus areas

- Students will read for fluency and comprehension
- Build fluency with add and subtract within 1000.

Teacher/Support Staff will...

- Provide parents with academic workshops that focus on reading and math strategies.
- Provide parents and students with reading log to encourage reading nightly for 10 to 15 minutes.
- Provide information to Family Resource Center for checking out reading and math materials.

Parent/Guardian, and Family will....

- Attend school wide academic workshops which will focus on reading and math strategies. This will allow us to utilize this at home to better support my child.
- Read with you child for 10-15 minutes daily and help them log their books.
- Use the Family Resource Center to check out reading and math materials.

Students will....

- Use materials from parent workshops that parents/guardian attended that focus on reading and math.
- Read for 10-15 minutes daily with family member(s).
- Use the resources that my parent/guardian check out from the Family Resource Center.

Download Class Dojo to you phone, computer, or iPad so that you can monitor your child success.

Compact will be reviewed during parent/ teacher conferences and throughout different school family events.
