School goals 2019-2020

3rd Grade Reading

By May 2020, the percentage of students in **Third Grade** scoring at the Developing Learner level or above on the Georgia Milestones ELA Assessment will increase by 10 %

3rd Grade Mathematics

By May 2020, the percentage of students in **Third Grade** scoring at the Developing Learner level or above on the Georgia Milestones Math Assessment will increase by 10 %

3rd Grade Focus areas

- Use language skills effectively to answer a constructed response question.

For example: reading a passage and responding to a question in short answer form.

- Building fluency with addition, subtraction and multiplication.

Teacher/Support Staff will...

- Provide parents with academic workshops that focus on reading and math strategies.
- Provide Parent Resource Center for checking out reading and math materials.
- Provide students with reading log to encourage reading nightly for 20 to 25 minutes.

Parent/Guardian, and Family will....

- Attend school wide academic workshops which will focus on reading and math. Strategies. This will allow us to utilize this at home to better support my child.
- Utilize the Parent Resource Center to check out reading and math materials.
- Read with you child for 20 to 25 minutes daily and help them log their books.

Students will....

- Use materials from parent workshops that parents/guardian attended that focus on reading and math.
- Use the resources that my parent/guardian check out from the Parent Resource Center.
- Read for 20 to 25 minutes daily with family member(s).
