School goals 2019-2020

4th Grade Reading

By May 2020, the percentage of students in **Fourth Grade** scoring at the Developing Learner level or above on the Georgia Milestones ELA Assessment will increase by 10%.

4th Grade Mathematics

By May 2020, increase the percentage of students in **Fourth Grade** students scoring at the Developing Learner level or above on the Georgia Milestones Math Assessment by 10 %.

4th Grade Focus areas

- Identify Main ideas
- Read for fluency and Comprehension
- Build fluency with subtraction w/regrouping
- Build fluency with Subtraction and Multiplication

Teacher/Support Staff will...

- Provide parents with academic workshops that focus on reading and math strategies.
- Provide students with reading log to encourage reading nightly for 25 to 30 minutes.
- Provide Parent Resource Center for checking out reading and math materials.
- Provide a book list that parents can use to encourage their child to read more at home for enjoyment.

Parent/Guardian, and Family will....

- Attend school wide academic workshops which will focus on reading and math strategies. This will allow us to utilize this at home to better support my child.
- Read with you child for 25 to 30 minutes daily and help them log their books.
- Utilize the Parent Resource Center to check out reading and math materials.
- Use the book list with my child to encourage him/ her to read more at home.

Students will....

- Use materials from parent workshops that parents/guardian attended.
- Read for 25 to 30 minutes daily with family member(s).
- Use the resources that my parent/guardian check out from the Parent Resource Center.
- Use the book list that was given by my teacher to become a stronger reader
