FCS Coronavirus update March 10

March 10 - Fulton County Schools (FCS) continues to work with public health officials after learning on Monday, March 9 that an employee of the school district tested positive for coronavirus, otherwise known as COVID-19.

“FCS remains focused on the safety of our schools and community,” said Superintendent Mike Looney. “We are working continuously with our partners, local municipalities and health departments to provide our community with updates and additional information.”

While the cleaning and disinfecting process continues at all schools in the FCS district, schools will stay closed on Wednesday, March 11. Bear Creek and Woodland Middle Schools will need to have additional steps taken at these locations since the employee with the confirmed case of coronavirus had direct contact at these locations. These schools will remain closed at this time. Woodland Middle is expected to reopen on Tuesday, March 17 and Bear Creek on Monday, March 23. FCS buses are also being cleaned and disinfected.

“Fulton County Schools has been in constant contact with our office regarding this confirmed COVID-19 case and we greatly appreciate their close collaboration,” said Press Secretary for Governor Kemp, Cody Hall. “Dr. Looney and his team have been transparent and proactive with Department of Public Health and our office from the beginning of this process, and we look forward to working together to protect the health and safety of Fulton County families and students in the days and weeks ahead.”
