School board to meet virtually April 2

The Fulton County Board of Education plans to meet virtually Thursday, April 2, at 3 p.m. for a called board meeting.

The school board will meet at 3 p.m. for executive session, followed by the called open meeting at approximately 3:30 p.m.

All topics up for approval are posted on BoardDocs, a website that makes the school board agenda and all supporting documents available online.

School board meetings can be watched live in a variety of ways. You may access via television at FCSTV Comcast Channel 24, AT&T Ch. 99, and Google Fiber TV Ch. 145. Meetings will also be streamed live on the FCSTV Communications website, which can be viewed using this link or at www.fultonschools.org/fcstv.
