

Scholar Parking Rules & Agreement

Langston Hughes High School

School Year 2022 – 2023

Upon registering your vehicle, you will need to read and review the parking rules and regulations. Parking decals and spaces are issued on a yearly basis to those who qualify. Scholars must provide all required information listed in the application and adhere to the rules contained herein. Parking permits are issued upon completion of an application to include a legible copy of applicant's driver's license and insurance card for the vehicle registered, payment of parking fee, and signed copy of parking rules. Submission of the online application shall be construed as acceptance of the parking and operation rules and regulations. It is the responsibility of the scholar to apply for a parking permit. The steps to complete the application can be found on the LHHS website. The Scholar Parking Rules and Agreement page with scholar signatures, submitted application, a copy of scholar's driver's license, and valid insurance card shall be submitted to the Mr. Haire before you are approved to purchase a parking permit. The fee for parking on campus for the 2022 – 2023 school year will be \$60 and is non-refundable for any reason (to include parking privileges being revoked). **The following rules and regulations will be observed at all times:**

1. Each person who chooses to park at Langston Hughes High School during normal school day hours must obtain a parking permit and that vehicle must be registered. A designated parking area and space will be assigned. Any and all parking permits must be completely visible from outside the vehicle. **Vehicles that do not display a current parking permit or not parked in their assigned space may be booted or towed at the owner's expense.**
2. A copy of auto insurance for the vehicle(s) registered and a current Georgia Driver's License, as required by state law, is required prior to the assignment of a parking space and parking decal; and will be kept on file.
3. The permit holder may not transfer, sell, alter, or counterfeit their permit to another scholar for any reason.
4. Priority in assignment of parking spaces will be first come, first served.
5. The student code of conduct will apply to all campus events and all parking locations approved and provided by the local school, school support organizations, or the School District.
6. The driver/owner of any vehicle will be responsible for the use of his/her vehicle and for any results of such use.
7. All scholars parking on campus will be subject to the Fulton County Schools discipline consequences that include but are not limited to reports to law enforcement, in-school suspension, out-of-school suspension, and expulsion.
8. Scholar vehicles are subject to search. The School Police Department and the school administration reserve the right to patrol all campus parking lots with the purpose of providing security and enforcing state law and District and school procedure. K9 units may routinely sweep parking lots. If you are not comfortable with your vehicle being searched, do not park on campus. Scholars who fail to comply with a vehicle search will result in a permanent forfeiture of parking privileges.
9. Parking and traffic violations on campus subject to the discipline consequences include but are not limited to: parking an unregistered vehicle on campus, parking in the fire lane or handicap spaces, parking in entrance or exits of parking lots, failing to stop for "Stop" signs, giving false information or falsely registering a vehicle, parking in another scholar's parking space, exceeding the 10 mile per hour speed limit, all applicable state law, traffic law and local ordinances.
10. The Langston Hughes High School Administration wants to emphasize the importance of being on time to school, or remaining at school, and attendance at school, and, therefore, may suspend or revoke a scholar's parking privileges based on excessive tardiness or the unauthorized departure from school. Scholar drivers who receive a 6th tardy in a semester, a 6th unexcused absence in a semester, leave campus without permission, or violate any parking or attendance regulation may be subject to permanent loss of parking privileges for the remainder of the school year.
11. A scholar's parking permit may be suspended or revoked at any time due to a violation of the code of conduct or law.
12. Fulton County Schools and Langston Hughes High School shall not be responsible for losses or damage to the property of users; including vehicles and contents thereof, of its facilities or any loss resulting in bodily injury.
