District 2023-2024 Goals:

- Increase graduation rate by 2.5% from summer 2023 to summer 2024.
- Increase percentage of students meeting grade level expectations on the reading/language arts Georgia Milestones by 3% from summer 2023 to summer 2024.

Cliftdale Elementary School Goals: 2023-2024

- Sixty-five percent (65%) of students in grades K-5 will perform at Tier 1 (on or above grade level) as measured by the i-Ready Reading Diagnostic by May 2024.
- Increase the percentage of 3rd-5th grade students performing at proficient (Level 3) or distinguished (Level 4) on the Georgia Milestones ELA Assessment from **32% (FY23)** to **42% (FY24)** by May 2024.
- Sixty percent (60%) of students in grades K-5 will perform at Tier 1 (on or above grade level) as measured by i-Ready Math Diagnostic by May 2024.
- Increase the percentage of 3rd-5th grade students performing at proficient (Level 3) or distinguished (Level 4) on the Georgia Milestones Mathematics Assessment from **35% (FY23)** to **45% (FY24)** by May 2024.
