Increase percentage of 3rd grade students achieving developing and above in reading on the Georgia Milestones Assessment from 67% to 72% by May 2022.

Increase percentage of 4th grade students achieving developing and above in reading on the Georgia Milestones Assessment from 61 % to 66% by May 2022.

Increase percentage of 5th grade students achieving developing and above in reading on the Georgia Milestones Assessment from 70% to 75% by May 2022.

### Goal 2: Math

Increase percentage of 3rd grade students achieving developing and above in math on the Georgia Milestones Assessment from 76% to 81% by May 2022.

Increase percentage of 4th grade students achieving developing and above in math on the Georgia Milestones Assessment from 68% to 73% by May 2022.
