A. Principal's Report

Enrollment/Staffing 2021-2022

- Face-to-face only next year
 - No simultaneous teaching or remote option at local schools
 - There is a year-long Fulton County remote option
- Masks
 - o Dr. Looney will follow CDC recommendations (masks inside right now)
 - o Any changes will be communicated after board approval
- Barnwell projected at 688 students next year
 - o 31 classroom teachers
 - o 3 staff members moving; rest stable
- Losing KSE program
 - Absorbed by Hillside Elementary School
 - o Staffing adjustments already made
- American Rescue Funds
 - Literacy coach and paraprofessional to be added to staff

2020-2021 Flex Funds Spending Requests - Status of spending remaining \$

- Be the Voice (\$0) Fulton County paid entire amount
- Classroom Library Books (\$5,929.75)
 - \$0.62 balance to return to Fulton County
 - Addition of 20-30 books per classroom

New RFF Process (Value-Added Flexibility)

- Offers choices schools can opt in or out based on best practices
- Creates possibility for school level innovations; make a case for changes
- Current flexibility requests continue through next year (2021-22)
- Training this summer, perhaps in August, for all SGCs

American Rescue Funds Act

- Program continues for three years (through 2023-24)
 - Science of Reading (LETRS Program) used to support reading initiatives
 - All staff members will receive reading training, which compliments our Orton-Gillingham training
- Fulton County providing a K-2 Literacy Coach
 - o Candidates must meet specific criteria so the right person is in this position
 - Principal to decide who to hire for their building; zone superintendent to approve
- Fulton County providing an additional Paraprofessional
 - Will tutor Champion Kids who need a boost
 - Students receive one-on-one support for approximately 15 minutes a day
 - This new person is in addition to the Paraprofessional already working with our Champion Kids
