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Good afternoon Raiders,

This message is coming to you from Alpharetta High School Principal Kersey! I am so excited to welcome back over 2,200 students to campus tomorrow. We had such a successful freshman Link Crew kickoff and freshmen and sophomore Information Day this week. It is evident students are excited and ready to come back to school on campus.

At 1:30pm today, I e-mailed home communication to parents on several important topics that students and parents will need to know, understand and sometimes take action on in order to start the year off successfully. Please do access that communication and read it carefully with your AHS student this evening.

A few important points that I also want to highlight here. First, due to the level of Covid-19 spread of infection being higher than 100 per 100,000 residents in the city of Alpharetta, Fulton County Schools is requiring that all students and staff wear masks to school starting tomorrow, Monday, August 9th. Please do not come to school if you are feeling ill or showing any symptoms of Covid-19. Also, all students should report directly to first period tomorrow. You may access your schedule by logging into Home Access Center or Student Access Center. Reporting directly to 1st period is a change in practice from previous years. Please know we will still require all students to report to Advisement tomorrow for our official attendance count, but advisement will take place during 5th period from 12:09pm – 12:39pm. All students enrolled at AHS must be physically present during advisement tomorrow in order to stay enrolled at AHS.

I have had many requests from students, parents and staff to continue with my Morning Messages. While I will not continue this practice daily for the entire year, I will use this mode of communication weekly to help our students and parents stay informed with important policies, protocols and events taking place at AHS.
