SCHOOL AREAS OF EMPHASIS: English Language Arts and Mathematics for grades 6th, 7th, and 8th

ELA and Literacy: Develop independent readers, Increase comprehension in all content areas

Math: Strengthening problem-solving and numeracy skills

As a school, we will

- Offer parent workshops to help parents learn literacy and numeracy strategies to use at home. Workshops scheduled for flexible times to accommodate morning or evening participation.
- Provide online resources: Infinite Campus/used to monitor student progress, attendance, and grades.
- Encourage the use of iReady at home to increase literacy and numeracy skills. Students should spend a minimum of 45 minutes on iReady per week.

Students will:

- Ask parents and families to participate in workshops for Math, ELA and reading resources provided by the school.
- Students will make use of Infinite Campus to monitor progress and keep current on assignments.
- Students will ask for parental guidance in using helpful online resources that are provided by the school (i.e. *iReady*, FCS Launchpad). Students will spend 45 minutes a week on iReady Reading and Math to increase reading comprehension, vocabulary, Lexile Level, and numeracy skills.

As parents, we will

- Attend Parent Workshops on Math, ELA/ Reading curriculum to learn ways to assist their child at home.
- Utilize the online resource provided by the school Infinite Campus/used to monitor student progress, attendance, and grades.
- Encourage the use of iReady at home to increase literacy and numeracy skills. Parents should ensure students spend a minimum of 45 minutes on iReady per week.

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
