5. Discussion Item: SGC Council Development Opportunities

 - i. S. Khandar & M. Rose will attend
6. Informational Item: Principal's Update
 - a. Semester Action Plan: We will be looking at the 3 Big Rocks (Relationships/ Routines, Tier 1, and Interventions)
 - i. Relationships & Routines: By May 2023, all teachers will have implemented and completed 95% of the SSS lessons with their students. Students Success Skills are age-appropriate lessons to teach strategies to students for social-emotional learning. They are taught weekly by teachers to all students.
 1. Action: Teachers will be provided with specific SSS lessons to complete each week & monthly reports will be assessed to ensure teachers are completing appropriate lessons with their students.
 - ii. Tier 1: By May 2023, CVES will increase the % of students in grades 3-5 performing on or above grade level in reading, from 91% to 95% as measured by the GMAS reading indicator.
 1. Action: Teachers will implement required lessons (Heggerty, Core95 Phonics, Vocabulary Surge, Wonders) with fidelity and Professional Learning Communities will analyze and monitor student data from minor and major assessments and have bi-weekly Kid Talk meetings.
 - iii. Interventions: By May 2023, 100% of students in grades 1-5 who began the year below grade level in reading will meet their stretch growth target as measured by i-Ready Diagnostic. The stretch growth target is how much growth they should make to close the gap, to get them back on grade level.
 1. Action: Students meeting below grade-level reading criteria will receive additional support through high-dosage small group instruction and/ or extended learning. Students' progress monitoring data will be reviewed bi-weekly during KidTalk and MTSS meetings.
7. Discussion Item: SY22-23 Council Initiatives
 - a. The school board also approved an additional \$25 per student to use on safety initiatives (\$24, 525 for Creek View).
 - i. What is Coming? The district is providing an updated camera system for our school. There will be additional cameras added and better quality. The district is also providing alarms on top of the majority of our exterior doors. Creek View will be piloting a program where a school employee will be given an emergency button to wear and will alert the front office of an emergency. The district also approved to place cameras on the exterior of the building to scan license plates that come onto our school campus.
 - ii. What do we need? Look at walkie talkie replacements, look into a metal detector for all visitors to be screened. Discussion to be continued.
 - b. We will receive \$46, 390 in Charter Funds this year.
 - i. Creek View has a lot of curriculum resources available for teachers to use and implement in their classrooms. We would like to look at flexible seating options to put into more classrooms. This would provide students with different places in the classroom to sit, other than their desk/ chairs. We could look at using the rest of the money for general educational materials.
