

What is a Title I School-Family Compact?

A School-Family Compact is an agreement between parents, students, and teachers. It explains how parents, teachers, and students will work together to make sure all students reach grade level standards.

Hamilton E. Holmes Elementary is served by Title I, Part A. This service requires that parents, school staff, and students share the responsibility for improved student achievement. It also describes how the school and parents will build and develop a partnership that will help children achieve Georgia's high academic standards.

Jointly Developed

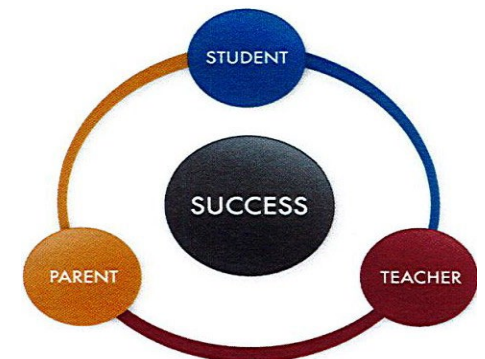

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Our Goals for Student Achievement

2023 - 2024 District Goals:

- The percentage of students scoring at Developing Learner or above on the Georgia Milestones (GMAS) English Language Arts End of Grade Assessment will increase by five percentage points.
- The percentage of students scoring at Developing Learner or above on the GMAS Mathematics End of Grade Assessment will increase by five percentage points.

School Goals 2023 – 2024: Grades K – 5 (Literacy and Mathematics)

K – 5 Literacy Goals

- Increase the percentage of students in grades K-5 scoring On or Above Grade Level, Tier 1, by 20% as measured on the ELA End of Year iReady diagnostic for the 2023 - 2024 school year.

K – 5 Math Goals

- **Goal 1:** Increase the percentage of students in grades K-5 scoring On or Above Grade Level, Tier 1, by 20% as measured on the math end-of-year iReady diagnostic for the 2023-2024 school year.
- **Goal 2:** Decrease the percentage of students in grades K-5 scoring two or more grade levels below, Tier 3, by 20% as measured on the math end-of-year iReady diagnostic for the 2023-2024 school year.

K – 5 Focus Areas (Literacy)

- To prove foundational skills by focusing on phonemic awareness and phonic skills.
- To improve reading and comprehension by focusing on fluency and vocabulary acquisition.

K – 5 Focus Areas (Mathematics)

- **Numeracy:** the ability to understand and work with numbers *and* problem-solving: comprehending problems presented, developing plans, solving, and reflecting on processes for solving
