Renaissance Elementary School is committed to transparency when it comes to our communication with families about children's learning. Some of the ways you can expect us to reach you are:

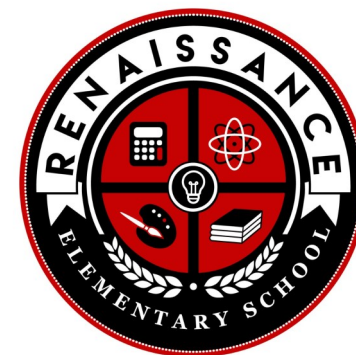
